Michelle is a rising star of the Ernabella painting studio. She is daughter to senior painter Atipalku Intjalki and master punu (wood) maker Adrian Intjalki. Her sisters are Langaliki and Lynette Lewis, both accomplished artists. Michelle began painting in 2017 and quickly developed an individual style based around her father's country at Makiri, east of Ernabella.

Her art has been shown across Australia and internationally, including at the annual Desert Mob exhibition at Araluen Art Centre, Alice Springs and Aboriginal Signature gallery in Brussels.

Michelle is mother to three children.
