



Maringka Burton

Born 1950

Language Group Pitjantjatjara Region APY Lands

Maringka Burton was born near the site of the Anumara Tjukurpa (Caterpillar Dreaming), south of Irrunytju (Wingellina) in Western Australia. Maringka lived a traditional Anangu existence with her parents Charlie Tjalkuriny (Charlie Burton) and Naputja Yanyi (Yanyi Burton) and siblings before settling in Ernabella, where Maringka attended the Ernabella Mission school.

Maringka is a highly-regarded ngangkari (traditional healer), having been guided in this practice by her father Charlie Tjalkuriny. Maringka's ngangkari work involves extensive travel and working alongside doctors and nurses to support Anangu patients in hospitals and clinics.

A respected senior artist, Maringka maintains a prolific practice across painting and tjanpi (native grass) weaving.

"I am a senior lady (at art centre), and I began working as an artist a long time ago, me and Kunmanara Singer were the first women artists at my art centre. I help look after the art centre and go to the big meetings for them. I also enjoy singing and I travelled to sing in the opening ceremony of the Sydney Olympic Games, I want to keep painting and doing inma (ceremonial song and dance) always. My father was a special ngangkari (traditional healer) and he taught me about healing; now I am ngangkari too. I do lots of work for the women's council, I'm always helping at their big meetings and supporting Anangu women. As artists and as a community, we should always do more work with the young people, making things together and teaching them about the old ways too, always remembering country, this is a good way."
